Surely goodness and mercy shall follow me all the days of my life. Psalm 23:6a

Generosity and *Goodness*. This is your bi-monthly reminder that during Year C, from Advent to the end of Ordinary Time—November 24, this year—we're studying the *Fruit of the Spirit*, which Paul teaches in Galatians 5:22-23.

A few years ago, I preached on the *Five Practices of Fruitful Congregations*, and one of those was Extravagant **Generosity**. Author Robert Schnase writes that people in churches give because they "love God, love the church, [and] desire to grow in love of neighbor." Most of us would guess the first two, but would we equate generosity with love of neighbor? And yet, the church is called to be the Body of Christ, and to make the Kingdom of God known in this life, so how could it not be?

Our church is going through a financial crisis, and I know part of it is because of increased money pressures people are facing, and I worry about that. Moreover, the church is no longer the only charity—orchestras, libraries and even podcasts are making appeals for limited dollars. So why give to the church? Because the gospel that Jesus lived focuses on the three L's—the least, the lost, and the lonely, God's preferred people. Historically, churches have taken better care of the poor than almost any other organization (and those that do a great job are often supported by churches as well).

Goodness is a trait we all seem to admire, but one that can be difficult to practice. Part of growing up is testing rules and authority, and some children, as they become teens, rebel against being "good." I know I did! But our trusty psalm above refers to GOD'S goodness, which even when we can't practice goodness, sticks to us throughout eternity. In turn, a life focused on practicing the disciplines of the Fruit of the Spirit, helps us to practice goodness, even when we find ourselves facing rudeness and evil. One of the hardest lessons we must learn is forgiveness of those who sin against us, seventy times seven times. It is hard to practice goodness under those circumstances, yet that is what Jesus Christ did, and what we do if we are to faithfully follow him.

Be generous to yourself and others. Look for goodness in the world around you—allow the cherry trees and magnolia blossoms to seep into your soul—and practice it in your own life, and seek it out in others.

Be healthy and strong. Meanwhile, I'll see you in church.
