Welcome to this Table—the Lord’s Table. Our newborn Savior invites those who trust him, and those who want to trust him more, to share this feast which he has prepared.

The Lord be with you.

And also with you.

Lift up your hearts.

We lift them to the Lord.

Let us give thanks to the Lord our God.

It is right to give our thanks and praise.

Why do we give thanks at this table?

You created light out of darkness and brought forth life on the earth. You formed us in your image and called us to love and serve you and sent us a child called Wonderful Counselor, Mighty God, Everlasting Father, Prince of Peace. In him, your Word became flesh and dwelt among us, and we beheld your glory: Emmanuel, God with us!

Therefore, we praise you, joining our voices with the celestial choirs and with all the faithful of every time and place, who forever sing to the glory of your name:

**Holy, holy, holy Lord, God of power and might
Heaven and Earth are full of your glory,
Hosanna in the highest.
Blessed is the one who comes in the name of the Lord.
Hosanna in the highest.**

Blessed is Jesus Christ, our Savior. Born in a stable, he is our Good Shepherd, and your holy Lamb. Lying in a manger, he is the bread of life, food for our souls. Praised by the heavenly host, he is the hope and joy of all the earth.

What do we remember at this table?

Why do we eat bread at this table?

Jesus took bread, blessed it, and gave it to his friends.

Why do we drink from the cup at this table?

Jesus gave them the cup as the promise that our sins are forgiven.

But this just everyday bread and juice.

Let us pray that the everyday bread and juice will become holy:

Gracious God, pour out your Holy Spirit upon us, and upon these your gifts of bread and wine, that the bread we break and the cup we bless may be the communion of the body and blood of Christ. By your Spirit, unite us with Christ and with your church in all the world.

As Christ's body sent to serve the world you so love, O God, we lift before you our prayers for the church, the world, and all in need, saying, "God in your mercy," and responding with, "Hear our prayer."

Gracious God, grant that when we are called, we may faithfully serve, strengthened and renewed at this table. Help us to repent and live in peace with you and with one another, watching and praying your new heavens and new earth where righteousness and justice will be at home.

Through Christ, with Christ, in Christ, in the unity of the Holy Spirit, all glory and honor are yours, almighty God, now and forever. Amen.

With the confidence of the children of God, we pray together the prayer Jesus taught us:

Our Father in heaven, hallowed be your name, your kingdom come, your will be done, on earth as in heaven. Give us today our daily bread. Forgive us our sins as we forgive those who sin against us.
