The Lord's Supper for Advent

This is the joyful feast of the people of God.

We have come from east and west.

We have come from north and south

To feast at our Lord's table.

When our risen Lord was at table with his disciples, he took bread and blessed it and broke it, and gave it to them. Then their eyes were opened and they recognized him.

Who can come to this table?

Our Savior invites all those who trust him, and who want to trust him more, to come to this table.

The Lord be with you.

And also with you.

Lift up your hearts.

We lift them to the Lord.

Let us give thanks to the Lord our God.

It is right to give our thanks and praise.

Why do we give thanks at this table?

We give thanks and praise to God, creator and ruler of the universe. The grass withers and the flower fades, but God's word stands forever. God speaks tenderly to us, with tidings of peace and comfort.

How do we praise God for all this?

We join our voices with choirs of angels, with prophets, apostles, and martyrs, and with all the faithful of every time and place who sing to God's glory:

**Holy, holy, holy Lord, God of power and might,
heaven and earth are full of your glory.**

Hosanna in the highest.

Blessed is he who comes in the name of the Lord.

Baptized by John, Jesus came to be our way in the wilderness, to wash us clean from the dust of death and the stain of sin, and to pour out the power of the Spirit among us.

What do we remember at this table?

We remember God's son Jesus, and we take from your creation this bread and this wine and joyfully celebrate his dying and rising, as we await the day of his coming. With thanksgiving, we offer our very selves to you to be a living and holy sacrifice, dedicated to your service.

Why do we eat bread at this table?

Jesus took bread, blessed it, and gave it to his friends.

Why do we drink from the cup at this table?

Jesus gave them the cup as the promise that our sins are forgiven.

But this just everyday bread and juice.

Let us pray that the everyday bread and juice will become holy:

Gracious God, pour out your Holy Spirit upon us and upon these your gifts of bread and wine, that the bread we break and the cup we bless may be the communion of the body and blood of Christ. By your Spirit, unite us with Christ and with your church in all the world.

As Christ's body sent to serve the world you so love, O God, we lift before you our prayers for the church, the world, and all in need, saying, "God in your mercy," and responding with, "Hear our prayer."
Please offer your petitions, ending with "God in your mercy;" all respond with, "Hear our prayer."

Gracious God, grant that when we are called, we may faithfully serve, strengthened and renewed at this table. Help us to repent and live in peace with you and with one another, watching and praying your new heavens and new earth where righteousness and justice will be at home.
Through Christ, with Christ, in Christ, in the unity of the Holy Spirit, all glory and honor are yours, almighty God, now and forever. Amen.

And now with the confidence of the children of God, let us pray together the prayer Jesus taught us:
Our Father, who art in heaven, hallowed be thy name. Thy kingdom come; thy will be done on earth as it is in heaven. Give us this day our daily bread, and forgive us our debts as we forgive our debtors.
